### Section 1 -- Statement of Purpose

#### Welcome

Because you are reading these pages, I have to assume that you are a Scouter who excited about using the vast resources of the Internet to help deliver that promise and a person who is eager to learn more. I hope that we can help you in your quest.

This course was designed to supplement existing training programs offered in your local Council and should not be used as a substitute for the excellent training that is available near where you live. Some of the material I have included is there simply to help you refresh your memory, assuming that you have already been trained.

If you haven't already taken advantage of the training your Council has to offer, please consider attending:

**Basic Cub Scout Leader Training** - This can help you understand your leaders much better. You will know what they have learned from training and where you can help.

**Scoutmastership Fundamentals Training** - This can help you understand your leaders much better. You will know what they have learned from training and where you can help.

**Basic Commissioner Training** - This is essential. Make sure you take this course as soon as possible. If you have completed the course, but it was several years ago, please consider taking it again as a refresher to build on your existing knowledge.

**University of Scouting, College of Commissioner Science** - The College of Commissioner Science is simply an advanced training program where your local Council offers a rich variety of course designed to help you further develop leadership, communications, management, and Commissioner skills in order to improve your ability to serve youth. This program is designed to be a three part sequence. In the first year attendees complete a basic program with some elective seminars to expand on basic training and capitalize on experience. The second year program goes beyond this with additional course work leading to a Masters. Finally in the third year program, you will learn how to take all of your training and experience and apply it to a long-term project resulting in a written dissertation on a subject of interest to you. The final product often will end up being a document that other Scouters can use to improve their ability to deliver the program to Scouts at the unit level. I highly recommend these courses.

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## Statement of Purpose

Well, if I'm telling you to go take training in your home Council, then what is the purpose of this course?



The purpose of this course is to act as a bridge between traditional Scouting training and outside training on how to take advantage of information technologies. It is my belief that with the proliferation of personal computers in individual homes and the ready availability of access to a host of communication technologies via the Internet, that we harness this opportunity to improve how we as Scouters share information that can be used to provide the best possible program to our ultimate customer -- the Scouts.

As Commissioners our primary job is to serve Scouting units. And one of the key functions we fulfill is acting as a conduit of communication between the Council and District and the individual unit with information passing both ways.

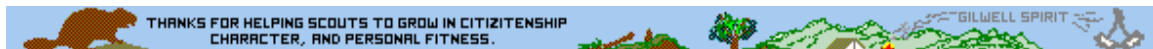

1. Learn more about Scouting - some World Wide Web sites are becoming virtual online encyclopedias of Scouting information.

3. Improve communication locally and nationally on a host of topics.
4. Capitalize on the knowledge that other folks have to solve problems or develop ideas.

Its purpose is to capitalize on the availability of information on the Internet to enable you to learn more about Scouting, see what others are doing, improve communications, solve problems, develop ideas, and better serve the Scouts in your area.
