Even today it is hard for me to relate these feelings, but I say this in hopes that it will help others to understand the magitude and scope of the Jamboree experience.

In 1989 I was fortunate enough to be an Asst. SM for our Council's Jamboree Troop and go there with my (then) 14 year old son. It was a financial burdon on us, and being self employed at the time, tough to take off all of the time necessary for the event, but with the help of fundrasing efforts, family and prayer, we made it work and it was (for the most part)a wonderful experience.

What happened during the third day of the Jambo (8th day of the tour) though, took me completely by surprise. I was coming back from one of the trading posts and happen to see one of the Scouts laying down on a lawn chair a ways from our camp. This happened to be a Scout that I was close to.. one of my sons best friends. (He was a large 15 year old boy who was a CIT at summer camp and an honor student at school) He was one of the "good ones" we all want our Scouts to be like. Well, as I approached him, I noticed he'd been crying. I, of course, asked what was wrong and got the "shoulder thing". Evidently (after talking/counceling for about an hour) he was homesick. He had been to summer camp with his troop, saw his family 1 day, then went back as a CIT for a week, saw them 2 days and then left for two weeks for Jamboree. It got to him. I was able to talk him out of the depression, and my son came by and took him to the phones where he called home. This was one of the kids I DIDN'T think we would have a problem with, and he told me (about a year later) that he was actually considering suicide at that time. (That shook me up). When I asked if he thought the Jamboree Experience was worthwhile, he said yes... it was one of the greatist experiences of his life. I too had felt homesick for my wife and two girls while I was there, memories I can still feel to this day.

Jamboree is a hugh event that takes a lot of planning, costs a lot of money, and can and will be stressful at times. It will not only effect the Scouts, but the adult leaders and their families as well. Is it worth it? Well, I went back in 93, and I'm going back in 97.... YES! As the young man said, it is one of the greatist experiences of your life!
