

Webelos Campout 20-22 October

Parents Guide

We are planning a Webelos Campout for the weekend of 20 - 22 October. This campout will be in conjunction with our Troop's campout to Chesebrough Scout Reservation, which is a campground operated by our Boy Scout Council. This campout is open to all of the new first year Webelos and the second year Webelos Scouts.

BSA regulations require that a parent, guardian or other authorized adult accompany each Webelos Scout on a campout. The permission slip that you will fill out will have a place to designate the responsible adult.

We will be preparing food as a unit. The total cost for the 2-night campout will be \$10 per person. Make your checks payable to Cub Scout Pack 92

We are looking forward to this campout as a great time for the new Webelos to learn about the program, and to get to know the second year scouts. Scouts, if you have any friends your age that you think would like Scouting, invite them to the campout. We will go hiking, identify and make samples of plants, and play games. It will be a blast.

Location

Chesebrough Scout Reservation is located off Highway 9 on the Santa Cruz side of the summit (Hwy 35). About 3 miles downhill from the summit is Semperviron Point. Make a sharp right turn onto the Reservation road. See the attached map.

Travel Schedule

You may go up anytime you want. Some of us will leave Milpitas at 4PM so that we can get there and get the camp setup before dark. Wear your uniform on the trip up to camp and on the way home. During the daytime activities Scouts and leaders may dress casually.

When you arrive at Chesebrough, drive down the hill from Hwy 9, turn right by the flag poles and drive up to the Multi-purpose/Kitchen Building. You can temporarily park there to unload your car, then move your car to the lower parking lot.

What to Bring

PACK LIGHT! From where we can temporarily park the cars and unload, it is about 1/8th mile uphill to the camp sites. The lighter we all pack, the fewer trips will be required to get the gear to the campsite. Consider the following list:

- Sleeping Bag
- Ground pad or air mattress
- Tent
- Clothes for two days in a duffle bag -- extra pair of shoes suggested
- Soap, towels, toothbrush, etc
- Warm coat
- Sweater or sweatshirt
- Flashlight or lantern

Day Pack and Water Bottles
Snacks or goodies as you wish

Food

We will prepare meals together. The \$10 per person fee includes the camping fee, Saturday Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner, and Sunday Breakfast and Lunch. You should plan to bring a bag dinner or eat dinner on the way up on Friday. The following menu is planned. Chesebrough Scout Reservation Instructions, Rules and Regulations

In Case of Emergency -- Located in the Multi-purpose/Kitchen Building is a phone for emergencies only. Located near the phone is a list of important phone numbers including the Chesebrough Scout Reservation Committee Chairman, Council Program Director, an Council Scout Executive.

First Aid -- In the event of an accident that requires First Aid, see a Pack or Troop leader immediately. Limited first aid supplies will be with each unit. It is crucial that the Buddy System be adhered to at all times, and that parents know the whereabouts of their Scouts at all times. There will be NO Chesebrough staff present on site.

Restrooms -- The restrooms are located in the Multi-purpose/Kitchen and are available for use by all units. Showers are located in the restrooms. Restrooms must be kept clean and cleaning supplies are located in the storage closet inside the men's restroom.

Fires -- Fires are permitted in designated fire pits. In dry weather, fires may only be allowed with the express permission of the Chesebrough Scout Reservation Development Committee Chairman, Camp Caretaker, or Council Program Director.

Trash -- All garbage must be bagged and hauled out when leaving. This option is strongly recommended, but there are limited trash facilities available. These facilities are very expensive to camp operations due to camp's distance from a dumpsite. Any garbage or trash left in camp will be charged at \$10 per bag. This garbage must be placed in the dumpster located in the Corporation Yard. Remember that a Scout is honest and leaves camp cleaner than he found it.

Parking -- Parking is not allowed at the camp sites. Parking is permitted in the designated lot only. You may drive to the Multi-purpose/Kitchen Building to unload. You must then move your vehicle to the lower parking lot.

Poison Oak -- Poison oak are known to exist at Boulder Creek Scout Reservation. We suggest that you keep to the trails and avoid climbing hills. Use caution at all times.

Prohibited Items -- As with any Scout outing, the following should be left home and are strictly forbidden. These items include sheath knives, electronic games, radios/tape & CD players, fireworks, firearms and ammunition, bows & arrows, wrist rockets, sling shots, squirt guns, water balloons, alcoholic beverages, aerosol sprays and playing cards.

Equipment

Tools -- Located in the pump house are tools for service projects. These tools include shovels, rakes, post hole diggers, mattock, hoes, etc.

Sporting -- A volleyball and horseshoes are located in the pump house and are available for use. Other sporting equipment can be arranged for use through the Council Service Center.

Carts -- The camp has several carts and wheel barrels for use to transport your equipment throughout camp (e.g. Transporting camping equipment to the campsites.)

Usage -- All areas of camp are available for use at this time except for the main Campfire Circle.

Vehicles -- Vehicles are only permitted on the main road into camp and the parking lot. Units which have reserved the Multi-purpose/Kitchen Building have permission to drive to the building to deliver cooking supplies only. These vehicles must then be moved to the parking lot immediately after delivery. Vehicles are not allowed on any other camp roads. Units which have been found violating this rule will lose their camp deposit
