Once you get to the front page you can hyper-jump to my course or go to Gary Hendra's Internet Scouting Guide.

This is something I put together about a year ago to bring our Commissioners around to the information age. It was merely a starting point, but it has proven popular. Now at last count 10 Councils have downloaded the course for local use and modified it accordingly.

When you take a look at it, realize that it is now out of date. Gary and I are thinking of how to proceed at this point and may disband the page or enlarge it. The reason is that I've joined with the project team at the U.S. Scouting Service Project Web site to create a number of web pages at http://www.HiWAAY.net/hyper/scouts and will be creating some commissioner pages at that site. What you may soon see is a relocation of the course to USSSP and then a doubling of its content. I already have about 32 pages of planned revisions that will be out in the next month or so. The original was 80 pages.

We at the USSSP site are creating a virtual Scouting Encyclopedia online. If you haven't browsed the site, I'd encourage you to take a look at what is probably the best and most comprehensive Internet Resource to date. You'll also find that NCAC is credited with a number of their pages!

I'd be tickled to help develop a local Commissioner's Course for the College of Commissioner Science. When I'm done with developing the revised web pages, I'll be in a better position contribute to a commissioner oriented course on using the information technologies available to them.

Over the weekend I'll send you both a comprehensive listing of some of the Scouting Resources on the Internet that has not yet been included on the Web Page (Its on my list of things to add/revise).
