This are very happy news. After many years of unwise division Scouting is re-united again in Argentina!

Scouting began in Argentina in 1908, shortly after the publication of "Scouting for Boys". An Scout patrol (of Anglo-Argentine students) greeted B-P on its way to Chile in mid-1908. Chile was the second official Scout Association created in the world. The Scout Association of Argentina (INSA) was founded in 1912 and granted a National Charter in 1917. In the late '30s a Catholic Scout Union (USCA) was created under the auspices of the Roman Catholic Church, and evolved separately until recently.

Talks of re-unification were started in the late '70s. Finally, an agreement was reached and a sole and new association was created in Buenos Aires yesterday on a joyful meeting of many hundreds of Scouts from all over the country. The new association, SCOUTS DE ARGENTINA, with about 45-50,000 members, has a very lovely and modern logo and badge and an active and exciting programme. The spiritual dimension of programme is open and egalitarian for all religious groups and faiths.
