PHOENIX 97

Leaflet - information - invitation

JUN|K - Association of Scouts and Guides of the Czech Republic will organise an international camp Phoenix 97 from 22nd to 29th June 1997 in Prague.

It will be the first big meeting of Scouts and Guides after the fall of totalitarian systems and after the renewal of scout and guide organisations in Central and Eastern Europe.

The Czech Republic is a small country of the area of almost 90 000 km² with about 11 million inhabitants (and about 65 000 of scouts and guides), situated in the heart of Europe. Its capital is Prague, a picturesque city with lots of historical and artistic monuments.

FROM THE HISTORY

Organising an international meeting Phoenix 97 we want to link it to traditions broken many years ago. The foundations of these traditions were made in 1931 by Slavonic Jamboree - a meeting of 15 000 Scouts and Guides from Czechoslovakia, Poland, Russia, Ukraine, Yugoslavia, Bulgaria and other European countries in Prague. This idea was then realised by the founder of Czech scouting and the Association of Slavonic Scouts - A. B. Svojsik.

It was continued by the meeting in Poland in Spala 1935, other meetings were not possible.

We would like to contribute to brotherly and sisterly contacts at Phoenix, to contribute to mutual understanding: we believe that we will succeed in linking to the heritage of Slavonic mutual friendship of A. B. Svojsik and to humanistic ideals of T. G. Masaryk, our first president.

Let us try to find what links us, but also to show each other

specialities of our cultures and our national traditions.

PROGRAMME

Activities we prepare for Phoenix will show not only fulfilling the Scout motto Be Prepared, but also possibilities of mutual inspiration in scouting activities. As most of the participants will come from Slavonic countries, a part of the programme will present our nations going back to their history, looking into their culture and visiting the monuments of the capital of the Czech Republic and its surroundings.

APPLICATIONS

PARTICIPATION FEE

Preliminary applications should be sent by the end of November 1996. The deadline of obligatory applications is 1st March 1997. It is necessary to pay the participation fee by this term (1st March). The fee will not be given back in case the participant will not be able to come - it is necessary to send a substitute.

The participation fee is 35 \$ and it covers:

- camping fee
- meeting activities
- an excursion
- a badge Phoenix 97

We recommend the participants to have the health insurance for staying abroad. The participation fee will be also paid by the service team.

PARTICIPANTS

The programme is set for Scouts and Guides of the age of 10 to 18. The key for the delegation is max. one adult for six children. It is advisable to have one adult delegate in each national delegation who

will be the official member of the council - and for each 30 participants one other delegate for service team.
(The contingent of national delegations will be given in a special letter to national central boards.)

CAMPING SITE

The camping site will be divided into five strongholds ("hradiste") - subcamps.

Each delegation should bring their own tents, event. a kitchen shelter. There will be a special camp for the service team as well as the family camp, Family Scouting camp, Old Scouts camp there.

For adventure scouts and rangers (15-18 years) there will be a possibility of hiking and more demanding programme.

BOARDING - FOOD

The delegations will prepare their own meals from things brought by themselves or bought at the spot. It is not possible to cook on an open fire, it is necessary to bring spirit or gas (propan - butan) cookers. It is possible to order the foodstuff in advance.

Service team will be given the food prepared - it is included in their participating fee.

INTERNATIONAL INFORMATION CENTRE

will be at the camping site for the whole time of Phoenix 97.

The language (besides the national slavonic languages of participating countries) is English, event. German and French.

THE POSSIBILITY TO STAY LONGER IN CZECH REPUBLIC

If you decide to come earlier or to stay after Phoenix 97, please, let us know about it in your application. We will try to offer you a route, possibilities of camping, sightseeing, etc. or eventual contacts with Czech troops.
