INTERNATIONAL SCOUTING TRIVIA - SCOUT EMBLEMS

RULES:

Each description that follows describes a Scouting emblem, patch, or insignia from a different country. Please identify the country that has the Scouting emblem, patch, or insignia described. No country may be used as an answer more than once.

My source material shows the insignia in black and white, so you'll have to bear with me on descriptions.

Answers and a listing of the Scouters with the highest number of correct responses will be posted during the first week of June.

- 1. Diamond shaped patch with a pine tree superimposed on a fleur de les that has a star on each of the "arms" of the fleur de les.
- 2. This patch features a three leaf clover superimposed on a cross atop an anchor. The patch is of irregular shape - flat across the top with the sides diagonal in opposite directions outward and the bottom an arc.
- 3. This patch is shaped like an oval shield with the outline of the fleur de les a star on each side. Inside the fleur de les is a triangle/pyramid shaped area that features the sun over mountains.
- 4. This patch is dominated by a bird facing to the right with a miniature of the international Scout emblem just to the left of the tail feathers and the words KEA SCOUT below the bird.

- 5. This patch will be tough. It features prominently in the center a character looking like Dennis the Menace wearing a campaign hat and neckerchief. To the bottom left is the international Scout emblem. To the right is a shield with a cross. Across the top is the legend "75 Jahre 1911-1986.
- 6. This patch is nearly tear drop in shap with a fleur de les at the top. In the center a rope encircles ten logs and forms a square knot above the logs.
- 7. This patch is rectangular. In the foreground a parrot is perched on a branch. In the background is a rocky shoreline with the ocean to the right. The name of the country is above the parrot and the word "Scout" below the parrot.
- 8. This patch is a rectangular strip of the sort that goes above a pocket. It bears the words "Bharat Scouts and Guides."
- 9. This patch is rectangular and features a bird perched on an anchor with four points and the words "Christmas Island."
- 10. This country's patches frequently display a lion in the foreground and mountains in the background. One such patch is flat on the bottom and rounded to a point at the top with the fleur de les atop the lion facing to the left. It bears the words "Lion Scout."
- 11. This country's patches frequently display a giraffe and the fleur de les to the right and the name of country at the bottom.
- 12. This patch is a shaped like a shield flat on the top and round on the bottom. Prominently displayed in the center is a rooster. It bears the words "Sois Pret."
- 13. This patch features a flag with the cross of Saint Andrew. Atop the flag is a fleur de les.
- 14. This patch features a crown and lion superimposed on

a maple leaf with the words "Chief Scout's Award."

15. Patches from this country have had the words "Pengakap, Pengakap Raja, Sabah, and Boy Sabah Scouts worked into their designs. In many of this country's patches two arms extend upward and are bent to the center to hold a flagstaff. The arm to the right is clothed with a prominent cuff. The arm to the left is bare. In some cases the flag displayed has a lion rampant. In others a mountain.

Bonus points: List all countries that have a patch with the words "Siempre Listo" included in the design and tell what those words mean.
